#### Year 3 Paradise Excursion

On Monday the 6<sup>th</sup> of March, our year 3 students headed to Paradise Country for a fun-filled day of learning and animal interaction.

When we arrived, we were welcomed with a morning tea which included a delicious freshly baked damper with sultanas. Soon after, the students headed Lexhibit. We listened to a talk on goats, sheep and guineaning before heading our

to the farm animal exhibit. We listened to a talk on goats, sheep and guineapigs before heading out into the petting areas to pat the soft goats and fluffy sheep. We were super excited to be able to watch the whip cracking, boomerang throwing, cattle dog rounding and cow milking during the first show of the day. Next, we headed to the communal grounds where we sat around the fire and learnt the tricks of the trade to master a billy tea. Then we watched the Stockhorse Show which taught us all of the useful tricks that a stockhorse can complete to help out the farmers.





In the afternoon, we listened very quietly to a talk on koalas and reptiles. We made sure to stay quiet so we didn't scare the vulnerable koala. Shortly after, we entered the Wildlife Walkabout exhibit that housed kangaroos, more koalas and Tasmanian devils. We roamed freely as we interacted with the kangaroos and looked in on the koala and Tasmanian devil's enclosures. The next two stops were dingos and meerkats. We listened to information about their habitat, diet and behaviours. To end the day, we attended Shaun's Aussie Adventure show. We learnt about the Save A Mate gang and watched as they worked together to save echidna from the top of Uluru.

Year 3 students had a wonderful time at Paradise Country and are keen to put the knowledge learnt into their English writing in the next few weeks.











Year 1 had a wonderful day at Queens Park Nature Centre last Wednesday 8th of March. Students identified animals and the ways we can all help conserve and protect their habitats. Students thoroughly enjoyed the day gathering knowledge and information.

#### Class Drama Performances


Students from all year levels are beginning preparation for their class drama performances. This is a time where students get to dress up and have fun performing in different roles for their assessments.
